- During the shortest day of the year (22 December) Shetland experiences less than four hours of daylight.
- Some areas in Shetland celebrate Auld Yule on 6 January, retaining the date of the Yule festival as it fell in the Julian calendar.
- At this time of year, preparations are underway not just for the festive season, but for Up-Helly-Aa. Nine different Up-Helly-Aa festivals are held across Shetland, beginning with the Scalloway Fire Festival on Friday 9 January 2009.

Islesburgh Community Centre will be the venue for the Shetland Hamefarers Club, where hamefarers can go to relax, listen to local music sessions and take part in specially organised workshops.

There will also be storytelling sessions, artists' and craft displays and showings of Shetland-related films.

On display at the Hamefarin Club will be the remarkable artefacts from a Hamefarin scrapbook kept by Jim and Rose Coutts. This wonderful collection contains newspaper clippings, photographs and original documents from the 1960 Hamefarin such as programmes, public notices, and correspondence. The collection offers a true insight into the preparations and celebrations in 1960 as Shetland officially welcomed

Hamefarers for the first time.

Full details of the Hamefarin Club will be finalised in the coming months, and will be publicised on the website and in future newsletters.

Islesburgh plays host to a number of events in the Shetland calendar, including the Fiddle and Accordion Festival and the Shetland Folk Festival. It has a café and several multi-function rooms, and is within easy walking distance of the Lerwick town centre.

WHILE YOU'RE HERE...

Although there is a full and varied programme of events for visiting Hamefarers over the course of the fortnight, there will be plenty of opportunities for Hamefarers to explore and experience Shetland for themselves.

The Hamefarin website has a list of places of interest around Shetland. These include interpretive centres, museums, nature reserves and historical monuments.

Those Hamefarers who arrive a little early will be able to attend the renowned **Shetland Classic Motor Show**, which will take place on 5-6 June at the Clickimin Leisure Complex.

The show features over 150 classic cars and 130 classic motorcycles, as well as military vehicles, agricultural vehicles and single-make models.

There are tours and cruises involving the cars from various eras, a parade through Lerwick, and a supper and dance in honour of the event. There is also a guided coach tour to Yell and Unst on the second day.

Much of the information on the show is yet to be confirmed. For up-to-date information visit www.shetlandcms.co.uk.

There are a number of other events taking place in Shetland around the time of the Hamefarin, such as the **Fetlar Foy**, a day of sport, music and entertainment held on the island of Fetlar. This annual event, which has just celebrated its 10th birthday has proven to be extremely popular in the North Isles and beyond.

The **Shetland Midsummer Rugby Sevens** is held at this time. This is an annual tournament in which teams from within and outwith Shetland compete over the midsummer weekend. There are a number of competitions,

including a children's competition, and the weekend is rounded off with a prize-giving ceremony and a dinner-dance. Visit the Shetland Rugby website at: www.shetlandrugby.com.

There are many other events occurring throughout Shetland at this time of the year. Subsequent newsletters will have details of other things to see and do during your time in Shetland.

Events still to be confirmed over the Hamefarin weekend include lectures at the Shetland Museum, pony driving, drama performances and church activities.
