

- Livestock exports in Shetland take place in early autumn. In the last few years an average of 90,000 sheep and 1,800 cattle have been exported from Shetland every year.

### TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION NEWS

Loganair has announced that extra flights are to be introduced next summer to coincide with the Shetland Hamefarin 2010 in June. Details of this have yet to be confirmed, but any information received will be shared with Hamefarers via www.shetlandhamefarin.com and the newsletters

The company will also enhance its service from Shetland to Edinburgh, with new midday flights on Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays from 23 May until the end of October.

In the Summer 2009 newsletter it was announced that the Hamefarin Committee reserved a number of berths on the Northlink ferries for the Aberdeen-Lerwick sailings immediately before and after the Shetland Hamefarin 2010.

Northlink Ferries Ltd have kindly granted a 30%

honorary islander discount to all those travelling to Shetland for the Hamefarin.

This discount applies to the cost of passage and cars however does not apply to the cost of booking cabins.

Remember to quote reservation code **N10VST-01** when booking.

To make sponsorship reservations with NorthLink, please call the reservations line on +44 (0) 845 6000 449 and quote the reservation code above. This will enable Hamefarers to access the specially discounted fare of Honorary Islander rates of 30% discount on passenger and vehicle fares.

Please note, all passengers aged 16 years and over travelling with NorthLink must be in possession of photographic ID at check-in. Examples of acceptable ID include: NorthLink ID card with verified colour picture on reverse, photo driving licence, passport and national identity card. Midbrake, North Yell originally belonged to the Spence family in the 16th C and, when George Spence became the last of the male line, it was passed to his daughter. Barbara who married James Dunbar of Weathersta. Their daughter, Mary married Thomas Irvine on 30th January 1745. Mary and Thomas built the present Haa, and it is their Coat of Arms which was above the door, and can now be seen in the museum in Burravoe on Yell and is depicted on the Hamefarin quilt. The grandson of Thomas and Mary, also Thomas, (1790-1877) was the last laird of Midbrake. Thomas never married but had a daughter, Susanna who married Bruce Sutherland in 1852. Kenny Brown, is the greatgreat grandson of Thomas.

Ann continued - "The stories are fascinating and very diverse. Hopefully we will get them put together for a book to accompany the quilt. I know that many of those contributing are really looking forward to coming home and enjoying themselves during the two week festival - I know I am!".

### SHETLAND CATTLE HERD BOOK SOCIETY

The Shetland Hamefarin 2010 will commemorate the 50th anniversary of the original Hamefarin, but one organisation in Shetland will be celebrating an even more momentous milestone.

Originally constituted in 1910, the Shetland Cattle Herd Book Society is an organisation dedicated to maintaining the purity of the Shetland breed.

The Society originally published annual registrations from 1912 to 1921. Although the Society remained active, it was not until 1981 that the Herd Book was resurrected, when it became apparent that the breed faced the possibility of extinction.


Shetland Cattle have been present on the isles for around 3,000 years, and are noted for their 'qualities of thriftiness, productivity and hardiness', which have been gained through generations of adapting to the rigours of the Shetland environment.

It is estimated that the stock of purebred Shetland 'kye' reached 20,000 in the 19th Century, but this dwindled to around 50 pedigree cattle in the mid-to-late 20th Century. It is thought that this was due to the establishment of shipping lines allowing for the export of cattle, which meant that crofters could import bulls of mainland breeds, which produced larger calves.

Shetland Cattle are comparatively small, but well-proportioned. On average a mature cow weighs 8.5cwt (431kg) and a grown bull weighs 12cwt (610kg).

The Herd Book was reestablished after work done by the Rare Breed Survival Trust in the 1970s. Currently the Shetland breed is on the 'At Risk' designation of the RBST.

To commemorate the centenary, the Breeders Group have produced A Pictorial Daander Trowe Shetland's Crofting Culture, a hardback book compiling stories and chronicles from the 100-year history of the Society, illustrated by over 500 photographs. The book is a chronicle of crofting life and the dependence of Shetland crofters on the precious Shetland kye. A foreword to the book has been penned by HRH Prince Charles.



The Society are also preparing a Centenary Celebration to give all attendees a real flavour of Shetland and its heritage and how Shetland Cattle were central to family life in the country.
