Shetland in Stats

- The weather in Shetland can be unpredictable and severe at most times of the year, but especially in winter. The lowest temperature recorded in the winter months was -8.9 © in January 1959, and the highest gust of wind was 109.2 knots, which occurred in January 1960 and again in January 1992.
- Plans for Up-Helly-Aa are always well advanced at this time of year, but 2010 will see even more preparations as guizers gear up for the first ever South Mainland Up-Helly-Aa.

With 2010 almost upon us, the Shetland Hamefarin Committee would like to extend the warmest wishes for the season to you all.

After a lot of planning, the Hamefarin is fast approaching, although there is still plenty of work to do to ensure that next summer is one to remember!

One of the most important parts of the Hamefarin will be the local area coach trips to the various parts of Shetland. These visits will be a great opportunity for Hamefarers to visit the homes of their forebears, to research family history, catch up with relatives or just to do some sightseeing and take part in activities, such as golf, fishing or birdwatching.

Members of the Hamefarin Committee have been meeting with local community and history groups to draw together plans for local events. These plans are to be confirmed soon. Hamefarers will be kept up-to-date on all events via the newsletters and the website.

Also to be confirmed in the New Year are the line-ups for the concerts and dances which are planned for the Hamefarin fortnight. The Shetland Folk Festival Society and the Shetland Fiddle and Accordion Club are drawing together local and international artists for these events, and line-ups will be publicised soon.

The Hamefarin website, www.shetlandhamefarin.com, is currently undergoing a revamp. The newly-refurbished website will be launched early in January 2010.

Laughton Johnston's book, A Kist Of Emigrants, is to be launched during the Hamefarin. The book draws together stories of Shetland emigrants spanning the globe, and is a fascinating history of Shetland emigration, written with

insight and humour. The launch of the book is bound to be one of the true highlights of the Hamefarin. The launch date will be publicised when confirmed.

Details of the Hamefarin Club will be finalised in the coming weeks. The Club is expected to be the focal point in Lerwick for Hamefarers, as a meeting point and as a place to catch up with others. There will be a programme of events at the club and details of these will be distributed as soon as they are available.

The programme of lectures at Shetland Museum and Archives is now confirmed and is detailed overleaf.
